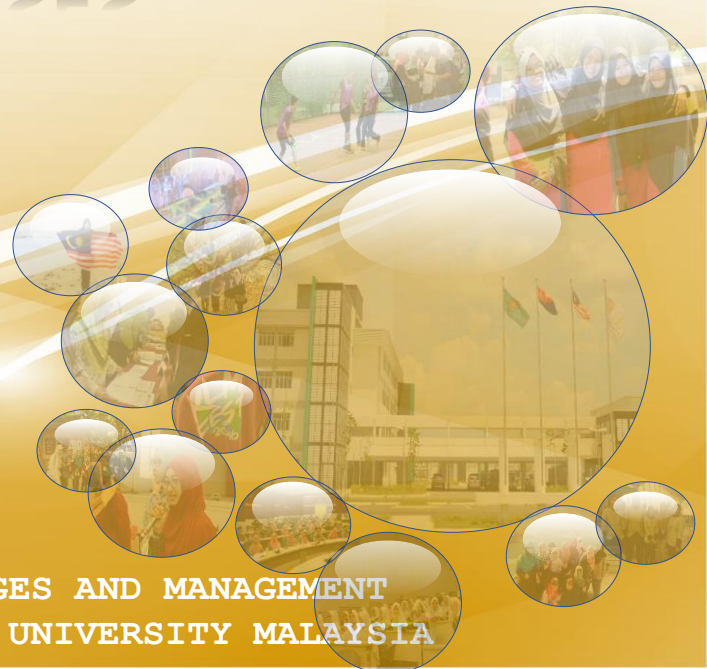

In 1991, the Education Planning Committee (Jawatankuasa Perancangan Pendidikan) of the Ministry of Education approved a proposal for the establishment of a Kulliyah of Languages, leaving the university to decide on the course and content of the formation of the new Kulliyah.

The Kulliyah started with 4 departments, English, Arabic, Malay and Tourism & Hospitality Management. The first intake of pre-university student registered on 12 June 2012. The programmes started with Arabic and English for International Communication. 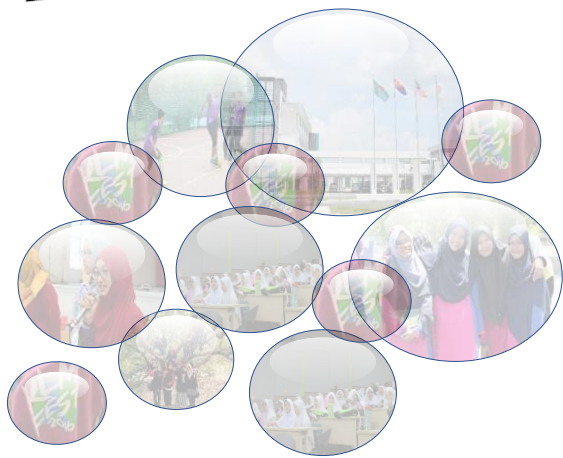

DESCRIPTION OF COURSES

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COURSE CODE	COURSE TITLE	SYNOPSIS
MESP 7301	Research Methodology	This course has been designed to enable students to embark on research in the context of ESP. Close attention will be paid to a number of essential elements of research and to types of research designs. The course has the ultimate aim of preparing students to produce a sound research proposal which consists of an introduction, a critical review of the literature, and a section on the methodological approach. Students will be guided in problem identification and will learn to formulate research questions/hypotheses, operationalize concepts, obtain a sample from its population, and choose accurate data collection and data analysis procedures. The Islamic concerns of research methodology will also be highlighted.
MESP 7302	Islamization of Knowledge in ESP	This course will provide the origin, development and historical background of Islamization of knowledge. Attention will be given to epistemological and methodological issues in Islamization of knowledge. Special emphasis is given on the relevance of Islamization of knowledge especially in the context of English for Specific Purposes.
MESP 7303	Principles of Applied Linguistics in ESP	This course gives a broad overview of Applied Linguistics in the context of English for Specific Purposes. Important areas in the field are introduced, and the various research approaches used are presented. The pedagogical implication of these areas are discussed.
MESP 7304	ESP Teaching Methods	This is a course on teaching methodology in English for Specific Purposes. This course will give students an exposure to the general knowledge, attitude and skills needed in the field of teaching English for Specific Purposes. Students will be taught to consider important issues such as teaching approaches chosen, types of learners, background of learners and their needs for acquiring the language.

DESCRIPTION OF COURSES

COURSE CODE	COURSE TITLE	SYNOPSIS
MESP 7305	Materials Development in Language Teaching in ESP	This course will provide students with an exposure to materials development in the specific field of English for Specific Purposes. Students will be taught the basic framework of materials design. They will be guided through the processes involved in materials design. The use and adaptation of authentic materials is one of the important criteria in ESP. Students will also be exposed to a case study of materials design. Following from this, they will be given the opportunity to have a hands-on experience of creating their own classroom materials using authentic texts.
MESP 7306	Course Design in ESP	This course is a research seminar on course design in TESP for students in the Masters programme. In this course, each student will appraise an ESP course and conduct a systematic design of an ESP course. The product of this investigation will be a project paper on English for Specific Purposes programme. Class format consists of discussions and presentations of selected topics by a discussion leader. Each student will lead the class discussion(s) on his/her choice of topic(s) during the weekly class discussions. Students will present a review of the topic, identify important issues, and suggest additional readings. Each student is also required to submit a reaction paper on the selected topic(s) during the discussion.
MESP 7307	Professional Discourse in ESP	This course gives a broad perspective on discourse in the various professions. The course explores the relationship between discourse and context. The various analytical approaches are discussed based on authentic texts.

DESCRIPTION OF COURSES

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COURSE CODE	COURSE TITLE	SYNOPSIS
MESP 7308	Issues in ESP	This course provides students with the essential knowledge on research and key issues in offering English for Specific Purpose courses. This course is devoted to understanding matters concerning course offering in the field of ESP. Some of the issues which currently influence and confront the discipline of ESP will be highlighted and discussed. During the discussion sessions, students will present their findings of the key issues raised.
MESP 7309	Language Testing and Assessment in ESP	This course considers assessment in regard to English for Specific Purposes, teaching targets, methods, quality indicators, and as wide a variety as possible. The focus is on teacher-made tests in terms of observation, selection and supply, performance, and direct personal communication items to assess knowledge, reasoning, skills, products, and dispositions. Assessment methods include written tests, observation, peer and self-reports, portfolio documentation, and performance/product tests in regard to planning the instruments, administering them, interpreting the results, and providing feedback that promotes ongoing, improved instructional decision-making and learning for specific purposes.
MESP 7310	Technology in ESP	This course exposes students to the range of techniques for integrating technologies into language learning. It also examines how computers may be used in the analysis of natural languages. Research possibilities in the area of computer assisted language learning will also be discussed.
